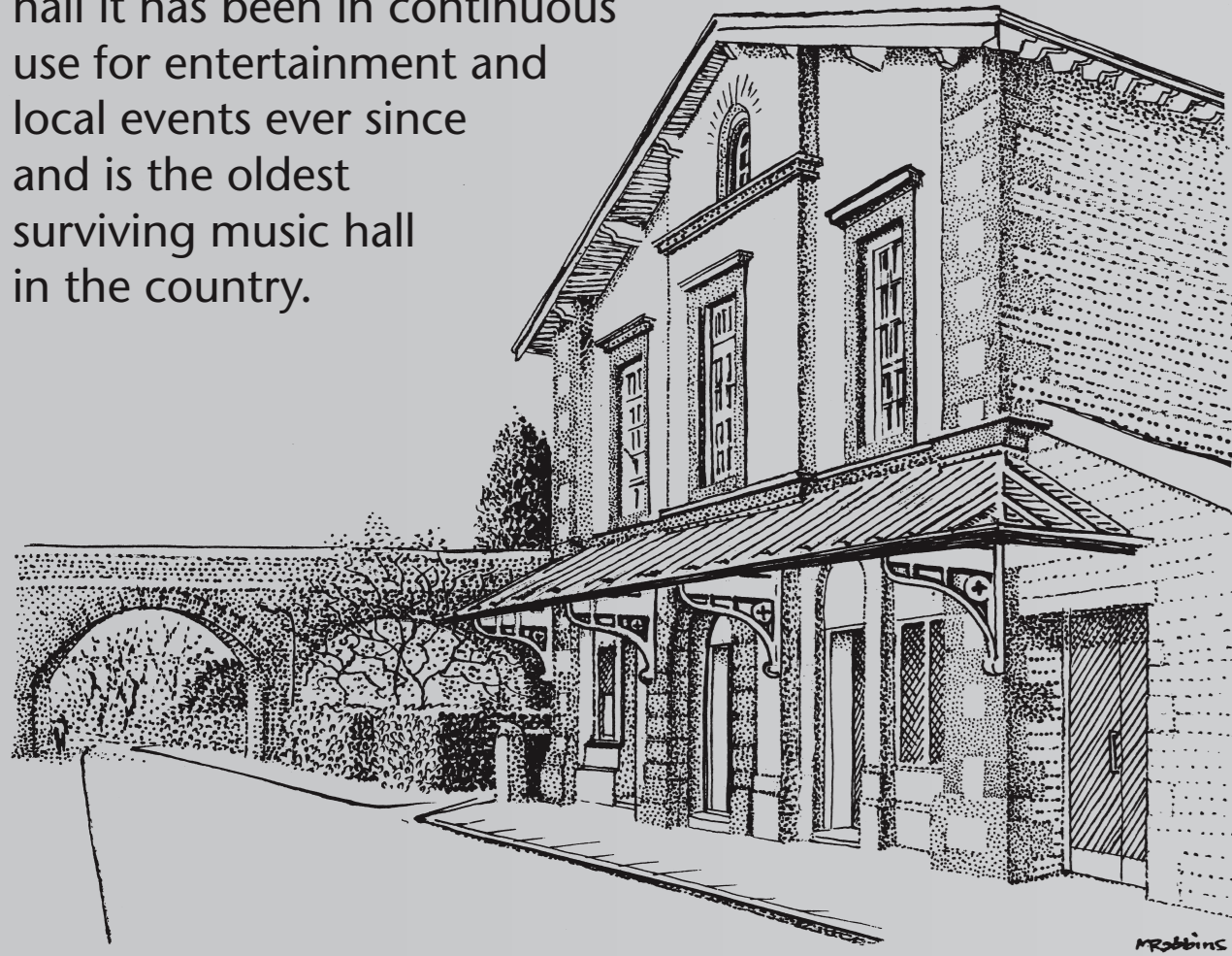


Victoria Hall on Kirkgate has a prominent glass-topped canopy above the front entrance. Opened in 1853 as a music hall it has been in continuous use for entertainment and local events ever since and is the oldest surviving music hall in the country.



The Shambles - A weekly market has been held here since Settle was granted its charter by Henry III in 1249.

It was built about 1780 as a row of shops with a basement below and single-story cottages above, with the upper storey added in 1888-89. It may have been built on the footprint of a building of about 1684. The Town Hall (erected in 1832) replaced an earlier toll booth with night watchman's room and the town's lock-up.



Cheapside This used to be the main route through Settle. The old road came over the hills to the left, continuing down Kirkgate to cross the River Ribble. The buildings facing the steps of the **Town Hall** mainly date from the late 18th century.

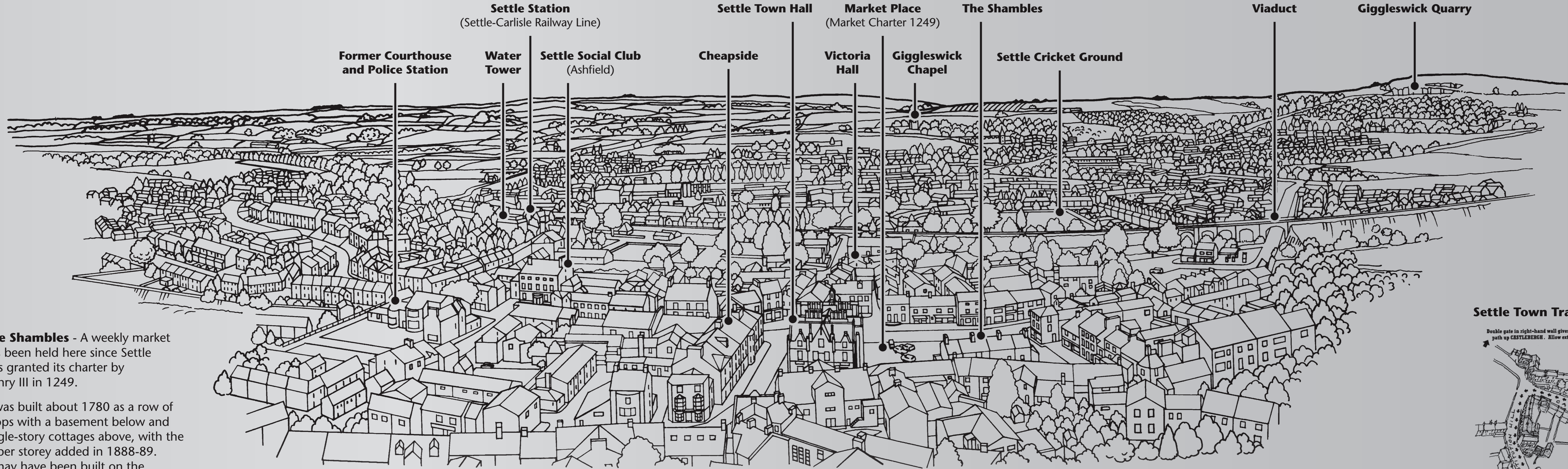

The Folly Built in the late 1670s as a gentleman's residence, this Grade I listed townhouse is now home to the Museum of North Craven Life.
